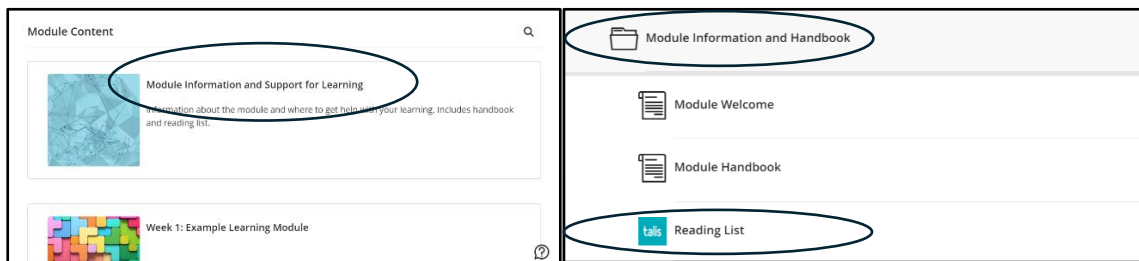


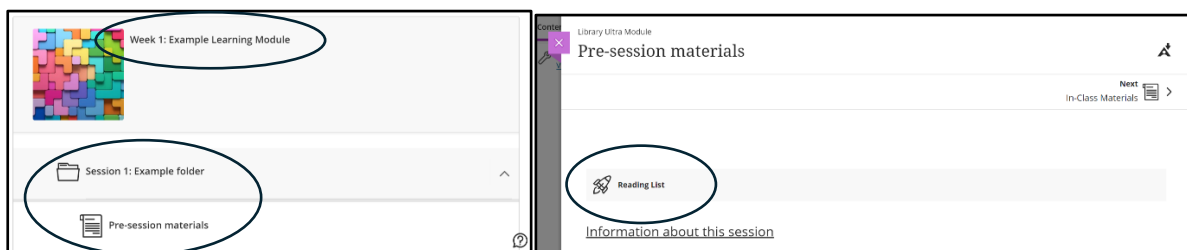
A Guide to your Online Reading List

2. See the whole list (your lecturer might have changed the name slightly).

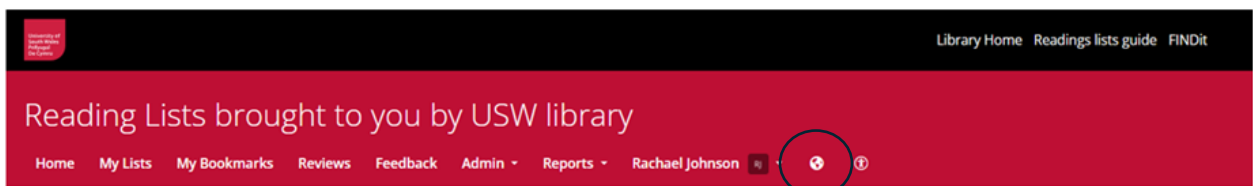


3. See sections of the list (your lecturer might have changed the name slightly).

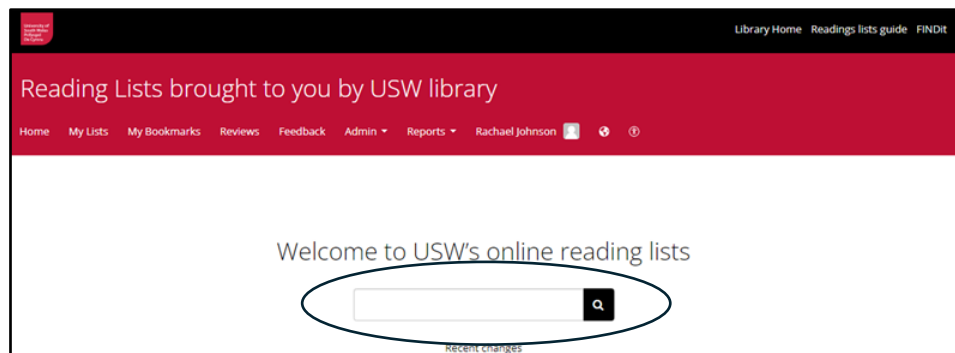


4. Can't find your list in Blackboard? Go to <https://southwales.rl.talis.com/index.html>

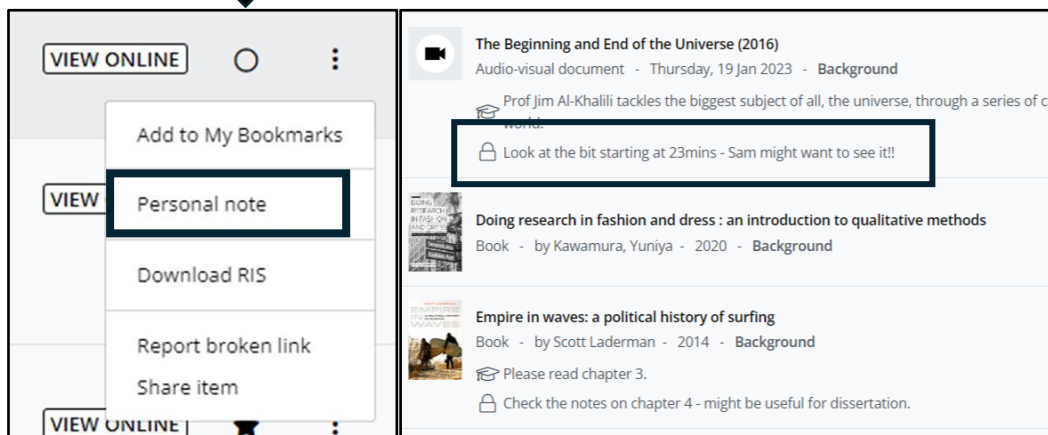
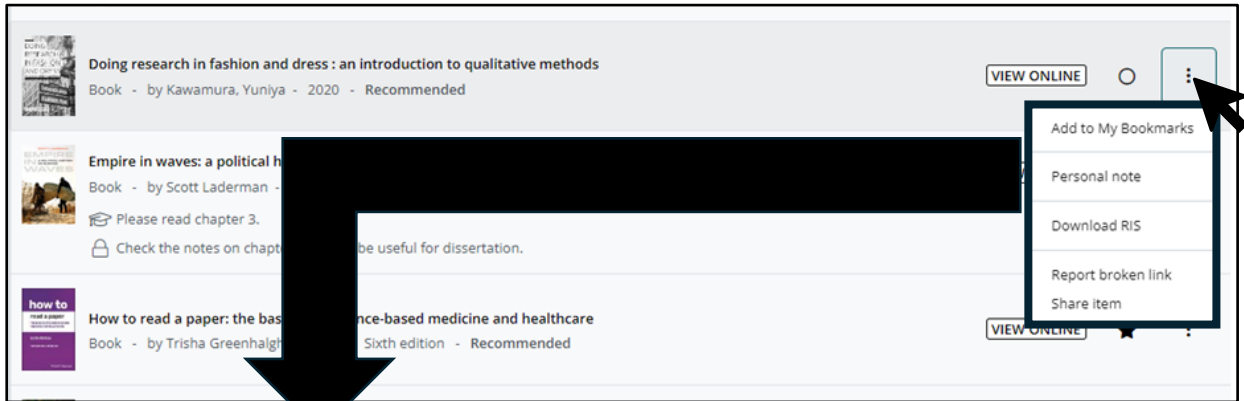
